Spotted on Site is a campaign run through iNaturalist. We ask staff and guests to download the App and take photos of the flora and fauna found on site here at Kirkley Hall.

This data is then used to look at what biodiversity we have here on site and plan future conservation projects to attract further wildlife here.



We are partners with Nature's Safe. A biobank that is actively storing live cell samples of endangered species.

As and when an animal passes or is euthanised due to medical issues we take samples to send to nature's Safe.

They store these samples to safeguard the future of our natural world.



We are active members of the Hog Friendly Campus Scheme.

Along with our students we are working to achieve various award levels by completing the challenges set by the scheme.

The aim is to attract and maintain a healthy population of hedgehogs on the campus grounds.



Northumberland College Wildlife Society is a student run group.

The Student group is very active helping out with conservation lead projects here on the campus at Kirkley Hall including camera trapping, helping with BIOBLITZ and supporting the Red Squirrels Northern England camera surveys.
